## ANTICHRISTS

Bro. Ellis Forsman gave us an excellent article recently on Fables, especially as received on the internet, and via email.

I received an email with video attachment recently I would certainly classify as very incomplete scholarship at least. It asked this question. Did Jesus identify the Antichrist in Luke 10:18? *“And he said unto them, I beheld Satan as lightning fall from heaven.”* It proposed the idea that perhaps President Barack Obama is the Antichrist; not based on his policies, but on his name. I hope to show in this article why this idea is false.

In fairness to the person who put this video out, they stressed that they were not saying this is a fact, just presenting the facts for the listeners to decide. The problem is that the facts presented were very incomplete, missed the whole point of what Jesus was saying, and missed the point of what the word “antichrists” really means.

I am not getting into politics in this article. While I respectfully disagree with most of the President’s policies, that is beside the point of this article. I am not writing to defend President Obama, but to defend the scriptures from misrepresentation. I want believers, especially younger ones; to be armed against this false doctrine should they see it.

The video based this idea on the Aramaic words Jesus might have used for “lightning” and “heaven”. While the New Testament scriptures were recorded in Greek, Christ would have spoken the words in Aramaic, which is more closely related to Hebrew. So instead of focusing on the Greek words which were translated as “lightning” and “heaven”, the video focuses on Hebrew words that could be so translated.

If you have a Strong’s Exhaustive Concordance, the Hebrew words proposed for “lightning” were 1299 and 1300. Both of these

are spelled (in English) Baraq, but pronounced a bit differently. The Hebrew word proposed for “heaven” was 1116, Bamah. So it was therefore proposed that a modern Jewish rabbi speaking the words of Jesus may use those words, sounding very much like the President’s name.

First of all, did you notice how it went from “Did Jesus name the Antichrist?” to “a modern Jewish rabbi may pronounce it as...” But in addition to this “bait and switch” routine, there are several more serious flaws with this argument

Problem number 1 is the very incomplete scholarship. This will take several paragraphs to bring out, so please be patient. When you see the numbers below, remember they are referencing Strong’s Exhaustive Concordance numbers.

The 1299 word Baraq is a verb, so was never translated as lightning itself. It was translated as “cast forth”, in reference to 1300, which is a noun that was translated as lightning. In fact, 1300 Baraq was the word most often translated as lightning.

However, four other Hebrew words in addition to 1300 were translated as “lightning” in the Old Testament. None of those four are pronounced remotely like the President’s first name. So in trying to determine what Hebrew (or Aramaic) word Jesus may have used, there are at least 5 choices. Who can say definitively which, if any, Jesus actually used?

A similar problem exists with 1116, Bamah. It was never translated as “heaven”. It was translated as “heights” one time. There were 6 different Hebrew words translated as “heaven” or “heavens” in the Old Testament scriptures, and 10 Hebrew words translated as “height” or “heights”. So again, with 16 recorded choices, who can say which Jesus actually used?

So with only one of 5 possible choices for “lightning” presented, and only one of 16

possible choices for “heaven” or “heavens” or “height” or “heights” presented, we can see the argument presented was very incomplete.

Is it possible the words spoken by Jesus sounded like “Barack Obama”? It is possible, but it is only one of many possibilities.

The next problem is that even if Jesus did use the word Baraq for “lightning” and Bamah for “heaven”, it completely misses the point Jesus was making. Jesus was not naming Satan as lightning from heaven. The point Jesus made is that Satan **fell** from heaven like lightning.

The context of Christ’s statement was this. Jesus had, during His earthly ministry, sent out 70 people to preach in Israel only. When they got back they were excited about the miracles they were able to perform. Jesus explained that since Satan had fallen, he couldn’t hurt them, because Jesus had given them power over Satan’s devices. Let’s read now the entire passage, including the surrounding verses, Luke 10:17-20.

*“And the seventy returned again with joy, saying, Lord, even the devils are subject unto us through thy name. And he said unto them, I beheld Satan as lightning fall from heaven. Behold, I give unto you power to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy: and nothing shall by any means hurt you. Notwithstanding in this rejoice not, that the spirits are subject unto you; but rather rejoice, because your names are written in heaven.”*

This real point that Jesus was driving at is exciting news. Because not only was Satan kicked out of Heaven, but he has less power here on Earth now, at least over us as Christians. He can still tempt us, persecute us, try to deceive us, but he cannot control us. We can resist the devil, (James 4:7-8, I Pet. 5:8-9), and we can overcome him through the power of God, (I Pet. 5:10-11).

Heb. 2:14-15 summarizes this for us, speaking of Jesus. *“Forasmuch then as the children are partakers of flesh and blood, he also himself likewise took part of the same; that through death he might destroy him that had the power of death, that is, the devil; And deliver them who through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage.”*

This video also completely misses the point of what the Bible actually teaches about antichrists. This word “antichrist” is most often used in the religious world to mean some political or military ruler who would try to take over the world and persecute Christians. Various candidates have been proposed over time, such as Saddam Hussein, Adolf Hitler, Napoleon Bonaparte, and so on. Now it has been applied to President Obama. However, if we search the scriptures, we see the word “antichrist” is never used in this way to mean one evil ruler.

The word antichrist is only used 4 times in scripture, all by the apostle John. Three times it is used in I John, and once in II John. It was never used to reference one evil ruler, but simply anyone who does not follow what the apostles taught, and/or denies that Jesus is the Christ, and/or does not confess that Jesus came in the flesh.

The first place John uses the word “antichrist” is I John 2:18-19. The very point he makes here is that the word is plural, and simply refers to those who left the apostles, not one big powerful evil ruler. *“Little children, it is the last time: and as ye have heard that antichrist shall come, even now are there many antichrists; whereby we know that it is the last time. They went out from us, but they were not of us; for if they had been of us, they would no doubt have continued with us: but they went out, that they might be made manifest that they were not all of us.”* Note – “many antichrists” – plural. And who were

they? Those who “went out from us”. Who were the “us” the antichrists left? If you go back to the first three verses of chapter one of I John, you see that John was writing as one who had seen Jesus, touched Him, and listened to Him. The first three verses of the first chapter of Acts tell us the apostles were chosen by Jesus to share His Word with the world. John was an apostle, writing as an apostle, with the authority of the apostles. The antichrists were, and are, simply people who left the apostles.

The second definition of an antichrist is one who denies that Jesus is the Christ. We see this just a few verses later, I John 2:22. We will read on through verse 23, which shows that when a person denies Jesus they deny God as well. *“Who is a liar but he that denieth that Jesus is the Christ? He is antichrist, that denieth the Father and the Son. Whosoever denieth the Son, the same hath not the Father: he that acknowledgeth the Son hath the Father also.”*

The fourth chapter of I John begins by telling us to test what we are taught; to be sure it is not false. Verses 1-6 give us two tests, confessing Jesus and hearing the apostles. In verses 2 and 3 in particular it defines anyone who will not confess that Jesus came in the flesh as an antichrist. *“Hereby know ye the Spirit of God: Every spirit that confesseth that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh is of God: And every spirit that confesseth not that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh is not of God: and this is that spirit of antichrist, whereof ye have heard that it should come; and even now already is it in the world.”* Verse 6 goes on to tell us to follow Christ’s apostles. *“We (referring to the apostles) are of God: he that knoweth God heareth us; he that is not of God heareth not us. Hereby know we the spirit of truth, and the spirit of error.”*

II John 7 gives the same definition, that an antichrist is anyone who will not even confess

that Jesus came in the flesh. *“For many deceivers are entered into the world, who confess not that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh. This is a deceiver and an antichrist.”*

So, who is an antichrist? According to the apostle John, the only one who used the word in scripture, an antichrist is simply one who does not follow the apostles, and/or denies that Jesus is the Christ, and/or does not confess that Jesus even walked this earth in the flesh.

Armed with this knowledge from God’s Word, what do we need to do about antichrists? Two things: be on guard against antichrists, and examine ourselves to be sure we are not one.

We need to be on guard against real antichrists. Certainly there have been evil men come to power throughout the ages. There have been evil people try to take over the world, and many who persecuted Christians. But, if you notice, John was more concerned with our spiritual safety than our physical. We need to beware of anyone who teaches against Jesus Christ, or who does not follow His doctrine as He revealed it through His apostles.

John went on to tell us to beware of false doctrine in II John 9. *“Whosoever transgresseth, and abideth not in the doctrine of Christ, hath not God. He that abideth in the doctrine of Christ, he hath both the Father and the Son.”*

Peter also warned us of false teachers in II Pet. 2:1-2. He did not use the word “antichrist”, but he warned of the same dangers John did, specifically false teachers who deny the Lord. *“But there were false prophets also among the people, even as there shall be false teachers among you, who privily shall bring in damnable heresies, even denying the Lord that bought them, and bring upon themselves swift destruction. And many shall follow their pernicious ways; by reason of whom the way of truth shall be evil spoken of.”*

We need to be on guard that we do not follow false teachers, or antichrists.

Last, we also need to examine ourselves; that we are not an antichrist ourselves.

That may sound like a horrible thing to say, but it’s true. John himself warned us to examine ourselves, II John 8. *“Look to yourselves, that we lose not those things which we have wrought, but that we receive a full reward.”* Jesus told us we are either with Him or we are against Him (anti-Christ). Matt. 12:30. *“He that is not with me is against me; and he that gathereth not with me scattereth abroad.”*

While we do need to beware of the world’s religions that do not proclaim Jesus, and beware of false doctrines among churches that profess to follow Jesus, most of all we need to examine ourselves.

What specifically do we need to examine ourselves for? The three things John said identified an antichrist. Be sure that we do confess that Jesus is come in the flesh, that we do not deny that Jesus is the Christ, and be sure we do follow the apostles and their teachings.

In Matt. 10:32-33, Jesus said. *“Whosoever therefore shall confess me before men, him will I confess also before my Father which is in heaven. But whosoever shall deny me before men, him will I also deny before my Father which is in heaven.”*

In Mark 8:38, Jesus said. *“Whosoever therefore shall be ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation; of him also shall the Son of man be ashamed, when he cometh in the glory of his Father with the holy angels.”*

Jesus gave His Words through His apostles, who not only preached them in their lifetime but also wrote them down for us. So we need to examine ourselves, and be sure we are following their teachings, because their teachings are the

teachings of Jesus. Acts 2:41-42. “Then they that gladly received his word were baptized: and the same day there were added unto them about three thousand souls. And they continued stedfastly in the apostles’ doctrine and fellowship, and in breaking of bread, and in prayers.” We need to be sure this describes us, so that we know that we are not antichrists ourselves.

In summary, the video in question presented very incomplete facts. There were 5 Hebrew words translated as lightning in the Old Testament, and 16 words translated as heaven, heavens, height or heights. We don’t know which, if any, Jesus used in Luke 10:18. Further, Jesus was not naming Satan as lightning from heaven. He was pointing out that Satan fell like

lightning from heaven. Finally, the word antichrist is never used in scripture to refer to some evil, scary ruler. It is used only by the apostle John, of anyone who does not follow the apostles, anyone who denies that Jesus is the Christ, or anyone who will not confess that Jesus came in the flesh. So we need to be on guard against such false doctrine, and examine ourselves to be sure we are not antichrist ourselves in any way. Brethren, keep the faith.

## *In Loving Memory of Bro. Eddie Franklin Tate*

From The Newcastle Church of Christ

We think the congregation here is the oldest congregation in Texas meeting as The Bible teaches. The original church was established about five miles west of Newcastle in Bro. and Sis. Morgan's home. To the best of our knowledge it was established around 1905. Some of the families that attended



in the early 1900's were Morgan, Pounds, Bishop, Norton, Tate, and probably others that we are not aware of. We think in the 1930's the members all contributed to a building fund and purchased the materials. The members joined with visitors from others churches and they built a building known as "The California Creek

Church of Christ". In 1964 that building was moved into Newcastle where services were held until we built a new building at our present location in 1987.

In Loving Memory "The Newcastle Church of Christ" would now like to pay tribute to a man who with his convictions, his steadfastness and his principles helped this church become one if not the oldest in Texas. In doing so he may not have only been our longest member, but perhaps the longest to date in Texas. He was known to those who knew and loved him as Brother Ed, Uncle Ed, Dad or Granddad.

Eddie Franklin Tate was born January 10, 1915 and passed from this life on October 7, 2010. We believe that Brother Ed was baptized around 1935. He was a member of this congregation for 75 years and taught for approximately 70 years. The following tribute written by his granddaughter summarizes who he was to many of us:

# In Honor of Granddad

Granddad's love for us was proven –  
not with material gifts or toys -  
But by teaching us about Jesus  
When we were little-girls and boys.

The worn and tattered pages  
of the Book he daily read  
are evidence that the life he lived

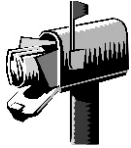

Dear Loved Ones,

There's not much news here at Bellflower other than our health problems. Bro. Jerry Perigen has recovered from a serious dog bite on his right arm, and is doing well.

Our Sis. Synda Swain continues to have severe arthritic problems and needs your prayers.

I'll try to give you a quick update on my recent health problems.

I have had a chronic cough for the last year that was treated on and off without much success. On 8/27 I had a CT scan of my lung and heart which showed I had a partly collapsed lung.

The night of 8/30 I coughed up gray looking matter and one large solid chunk of something. After that I started feeling fine and had normal breathing. On the morning of 9/20 I had a bronchoscopy (wrong spelling I'm sure) of my lungs which showed the lungs normal. That night at 10:30 I had a heart attack. The doctors now think my being off Plavix (a Platelet-ADP-Receptor Blocker) for the lung exam was the reason for the blockage in my heart. ## Harlingen, TX (Sept 18<sup>th</sup>)

Loved brothers in Christ,

I send you greetings hoping at the moment you may be enjoying good health in the Lord. Thank you for your friendship in Christ and for your fellowship with us in this work of the Lord.
