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Sleep

Sleep is an important part of our daily lives, giving our minds rest and our bodies a chance to recuperate.

God designed us to require a certain amount of sleep each day, and more at times, such as when we are sick.

Even God took a day of rest. It speaks to the importance of rest when you think of all the incredible things He created the first six days, and yet it was the day of rest that He sanctified. Let's read Gen. 2:1-3. "Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all the host of them.

And on the seventh day God ended his work which he had made; and he rested on the seventh day from all his work which he had made.

And God blessed the seventh day, and sanctified it: because that in it he had rested from all his work which God created and made." Rest is important, and God designed sleep as the main way we get our rest.

The Bible has quite a lot to say about sleep, and rest, and we should hear God's Word on the subject.



First of all, the Bible gives us help to get a good night's sleep. This was very important to me personally, because I went through a period of many months of insomnia a few years ago. I was having some health concerns, and was afraid they were more serious than they actually were. The fear and worry made it hard to get to sleep; then the lack of sleep only made them worse, which in turn made it even harder to sleep. Medicine helped me, and I was thankful for it. But it did not offer a permanent solution; but during this process that the Lord blessed me with some scriptures that did provide a more permanent and peaceful solution.

Basically, what the Bible says about getting a good night's sleep is to trust in God, to trust in His Word, and do what He says to do.

One of the major root causes of insomnia is fear. Trusting in God overcomes fear of worldly concerns. Doing what God directs in His Word and trusting in His promises can lead us to welcome Christ's return, easing our fear of it. And it is a principle throughout scripture that if we will do things God's way He will bless us – including, with a good night's sleep.

Let's look to Prov. 3:24. *“When thou liest down, thou shalt not be afraid: yea, thou shalt lie down, and thy sleep shall be sweet.”* What would cause our sleep to be sweet? We have to back up a few verses to find the why. We read in verses 19-24 that it is because of trusting and clinging to and walking in God's Word. *“The LORD by wisdom hath founded the earth; by understanding hath he established the heavens. By his knowledge the depths are broken up, and the clouds drop down the dew. My son, let not them depart from thine eyes: keep sound wisdom and discretion: So shall they be life unto thy soul, and grace to thy neck. Then shalt thou walk in thy way safely, and thy foot shall not stumble.*

When thou liest down, thou shalt not be afraid: yea, thou shalt lie down, and thy sleep shall be sweet.” Where do we find God's wisdom, understanding, knowledge and discretion, so that we can keep them? In His Word. And keeping these things that we find in His Word allows us to sleep peacefully without fear. Now, if we read on to verses 25-26 we find that trusting in God enables us to overcome worldly fears, again enabling us to sleep. *“Be not afraid of sudden fear, neither of the desolation of the wicked, when it cometh. For the LORD shall be thy confidence, and shall keep thy foot from being taken.”*

Look to Lev. 26:3-6. Of course, we understand that this is part of the Law of Moses, and as such is not command, per se, to us. But the principle involved can still help us to find sleep in the loving care of God. The principle we find is that if we live our lives as God directs He will bless us in many ways, including with sleep. *“If ye walk in my statutes, and keep my commandments, and do them; Then I will give you rain in due season, and the land shall yield her increase, and the trees of the field shall yield their fruit. And your threshing shall reach unto the vintage, and the vintage shall reach unto the sowing time: and ye shall eat your bread to the full, and dwell in your land safely. And I will give peace in the land, and ye shall lie down, and none shall make you afraid: and I will rid evil beasts out of the land, neither shall the sword go through your land.”*

Let's read Phil. 4:6-7, which tells us that God has given us the gift of prayer, to bring us peace of mind. *“Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God. And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and*

minds through Christ Jesus.” We don’t have to worry when we can pray.

Psa. 3:5. “I laid me down and slept; I awaked; for the LORD sustained me.”

Thus, sleep is an important natural process, and God’s Word gives us some good guidelines for overcoming fear and worry so we can get a good night’s sleep. It also tells us that if we live our lives God’s way He will bless us in many ways, including sleep. The guidelines we discovered are simple – to trust in God, to trust in His Word, and to do what He tells us to do.

On the other hand, the Bible also warns us not to be too devoted to sleep. We don’t want to be lazy. Prov. 20:13. *“Love not sleep, lest thou come to poverty; open thine eyes, and thou shalt be satisfied with bread.”* Prov. 24:30-34. *“I went by the field of the slothful, (which means lazy), and by the vineyard of the man void of understanding; And, lo, it was all grown over with thorns, and nettles had covered the face thereof, and the stone wall thereof was broken down. Then I saw, and considered it well: I looked upon it, and received instruction. Yet a little sleep, a little slumber, a little folding of the hands to sleep: So shall thy poverty come as one that travelleth; and thy want as an armed man.”*

We especially don’t want to be lazy, and asleep, spiritually.

In I Cor. 11:29-30, we read that if our minds are not on Christ when we partake of the Communion, we are asleep (dead) spiritually. *“For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh damnation to himself, not discerning the Lord’s body. For this cause many are weak and sickly among you, and many sleep.”*

In Mark 13:34-37, we read that if we are not doing the Lord’s work, if we are not ready for His return, we are asleep spiritually. *“For the*

Son of man is as a man taking a far journey, who left his house, and gave authority to his servants, and to every man his work, and commanded the porter to watch. Watch ye therefore: for ye know not when the master of the house cometh, at even, or at midnight, or at the cockcrowing, or in the morning: Lest coming suddenly he find you sleeping. And what I say unto you I say unto all, Watch.”

So we need to wake up, and be zealous and active in the Lord’s work. Rom. 13:11-12. *“And that, knowing the time, that now it is high time to awake out of sleep: for now is our salvation nearer than when we believed. The night is far spent, the day is at hand: let us therefore cast off the works of darkness, and let us put on the armour of light.”*

The next point we find about sleep is that physical death is referred to as sleep – a temporary sleep from which we will be raised on that great Judgment Day. I Thess. 4:13-18, *“But I would not have you to be ignorant, brethren, concerning them which are asleep, that ye sorrow not, even as others which have no hope. For if we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so them also which sleep in Jesus will God bring with him. For this we say unto you by the word of the Lord, that we which are alive and remain unto the coming of the Lord shall not prevent them which are asleep. For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first: Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord. Wherefore comfort one another with these words.”*

Finally, the 4th chapter of Hebrews refers to our eternal reward as rest. Verse 9, *“There*

remaineth therefore a rest to the people of God.” Verse 11. “Let us labour therefore to enter into that rest, lest any man fall after the same example of unbelief.”

So, God blesses us with a good night’s sleep when we trust in Him, trust in His Word, and do what He tells us to do. But we don’t want to overdo sleep to the point where we are lazy, especially in the Lord’s work. Physical death is

referred to as a temporary sleep from which we will wake to live with Him forever in Heaven, which is referred to as rest.

I hope this article has been edifying. We will close our study together for now. It’s bedtime.

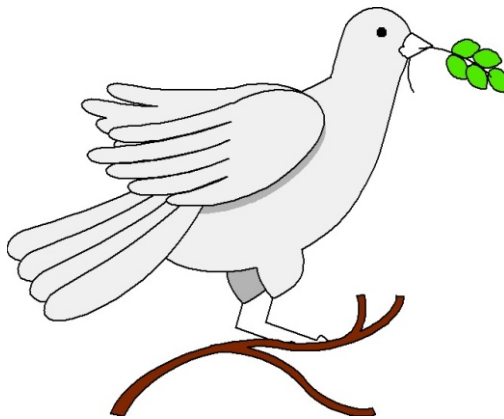

Peace of God

The world today is in great need of peace as we all can see around us. Some believe the condition of the world is becoming worse; but I wonder if sin is really more prevalent today than since time began on earth. We read in Gen. 6:5, “And God saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every imagination of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually.” Also, read Rom. 1:21-22, “Because that, when they knew God, they glorified him not as God, neither were thankful; but became vain in their imaginations, and their foolish heart was darkened.” The world has forsaken the command of Col. 3:15, “And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to the which also ye are called in one body and be ye thankful.”

Time after time, God said if Israel would obey Him they would be blessed and dwell in peace;

and if they did not, they would be cursed as in Deut. 28. Today, people are far too willing to call things religious that are not by the authority of the gospel. Read Mal. 1:6-7, “A son honoureth his father, and a servant his master: if then I be a father, where is my honour? and if I be a master, where is my fear? saith the Lord of hosts unto you, O priests, that despise my name? And ye say Wherein have we despised thy name? Ye offer polluted bread upon mine altar; and ye say, Wherein have we polluted thee? In that ye say, The table of the Lord is contemptible.”



After the attack of September 11, 2001, I heard people say they don’t know why God allows such things to happen. I thought for a very short while, maybe people might finally understand God really does mean what He has said all along; that maybe people would look to God for truth and not themselves. Now, with the latest of events with Terri Schiavo in Florida and all the other ungodliness we see,

tells me there really isn't much difference in today and the time recorded in the Bible.

We desperately need to remember 1 Cor. 10:6, "*Now these things were our examples to the intent we should not lust after evil things as they also lusted.*" God commanded Israel that they must not worship idols and graven images in Exo. 20:3-4, but they disobeyed God and worshipped things made with their hands. How is taking the communion in a way that is not by the authority of gospel, but by the work of men's hands, any different? The world does not remember these examples and still they worship images made by their own hands.

Considering the current events in Israel, Palestine, Iraq, Syria, and in fact the whole world, we see suicide bombers and murderers. Why do people not want peace? After a suicide bomber murders as many as they possibly can, someone retaliates and kills in returning evil for evil. These things are the power of the devil at work, and people still do not understand God will repay their evil upon their own heads.

Many of the Islamic's are radicals who say if they kill all who believe in God, they are promised to be in paradise. Some who convince others to be suicide bombers give documents saying they are guaranteed to be in heaven and give money to their families if they martyr themselves and kill the infidels. These are surely the fulfilling of the prophecies in Revelations concerning the battle of good and evil. These are more than wars between man here on earth. More importantly, the war is between God and Satan.

Let us also consider Eph. 5:21-31. In the interest of time and space, I am not copying the entire passage of this scripture. Also, I refer to Eph. 6:1-4 and Rom. 7:1-4. These scriptures tell us of the family unity and love and the

relationship of husband, wife, children, and the church. With so many marriages ending in divorce, peace and tranquility is lost, along with obedience to God. People choose to call things communion that are not in the gospel. People say they come to Christ by the way a sinner prays. Many believe they can establish their own church, calling it by whatever name they dream up in the vanity of their own minds. The world believes it does not need God's commandments to be faithful to God, and does not know the way of peace, neither do they fear God. Also read Rom. 3:11-18, "*There is none that understandeth, there is none that seeketh after God. They are all gone out of the way, they are together become unprofitable; there is none that doeth good, no, not one. Their throat is an open sepulchre; with their tongues they have used deceit; the poison of asps is under their lips: Whose mouth is full of cursing and bitterness: Their feet are swift to shed blood: Destruction and misery are in their ways: And the way of peace have they not known: There is no fear of God before their eyes.*" Many are content for the strength of their faith to be only, "Well, that is just what I believe." Many choose one verse and say, "That is what I go by." Read John 3:19-21, "*And this is the condemnation, that light is come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil. For every one that doeth evil hateth the light, neither cometh to the light, lest his deeds should be reprov'd. But he that doeth truth cometh to the light, that his deeds may be made manifest, that they are wrought in God.*"

Sometimes people we work with, sometimes friends, sometimes (with sorrow) family members speak of their religion not by the gospel. We see different forms and kinds of religion all around us in the world. Can we not

see how wrong the way of the world is? Or do we choose not to dwell on it because of loved ones not being faithful? 2 Tim. 3:5 tells us, *“Having a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof: from such turn away.”* Most one cup congregations are small with few members. But I would rather be with five faithful church members instead of five thousand or more that do not worship God in spirit and in truth.

The world, for the most part, has religion of some kind. And most people have good intentions. But good intentions are not enough. And those of other faiths than the one cup Church of Christ (which is the only church of Jesus Christ) have allowed the influence of the devil to prosper so well with them, they do not recognize how far they have erred from the truth. Let us read Gal. 1:6-7, *“I marvel that ye are so soon removed from him that called you into the grace of Christ unto another gospel: Which is not another; but there be some that trouble you, and would pervert the gospel of Christ.”* Those of individual cups believe the established and commanded pattern for the communion is not relevant and does not need to be kept, and that it does not matter as long as they call themselves Church of Christ. Also read Isa. 4:1, *“And in that day seven women shall take hold of one man, saying, We will eat our own bread, and wear our own apparel: only let us be called by thy name, to take away our reproach.”* Not only are we commanded to be called by the name of Christ, we must also be worthy of the glory and honour and the blood that was shed for the name of Christ.

At Ringgold, TX, our congregation is small, as is our simple little church building. We don't have a gym, playground, nursery for the children during church, a bus, a stage and auditorium, or

the other things of the world's churches. I suppose the world considers us boring; but what we have means more to me than all of their expensive toys. If the world's church toys are idols (I leave that to the consideration of others), they are certainly man's devices as in Acts 17:29. We might also read Isa. 2:17-18, *“And the loftiness of man shall be bowed down, and the haughtiness of men shall be made low: and the LORD alone shall be exalted in that day. And the idols he shall utterly abolish.”*

Having the truth is the only thing worth having. Other forms of religion, though beautifully polished and adorned, still are not worthy of the name, glory, honor, and blood of our Lord, Jesus Christ. I leave these thoughts in closing for our spiritual growth and well-being, the words of Paul in 1 Cor. 1:1-6, *“Paul called to be an apostle of Jesus Christ through the will of God, and Sosthenes our brother, Unto the church of God which is at Corinth, to them that are sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints, with all that in every place call upon the name of Jesus Christ our Lord, both theirs and ours: Grace be unto you, and peace, from God our Father, and from the Lord Jesus Christ. I thank my God always on your behalf, for the grace of God which is given you by Jesus Christ; That in every thing ye are enriched by him, in all utterance, and in all knowledge; Even as the testimony of Christ was confirmed in you:”*

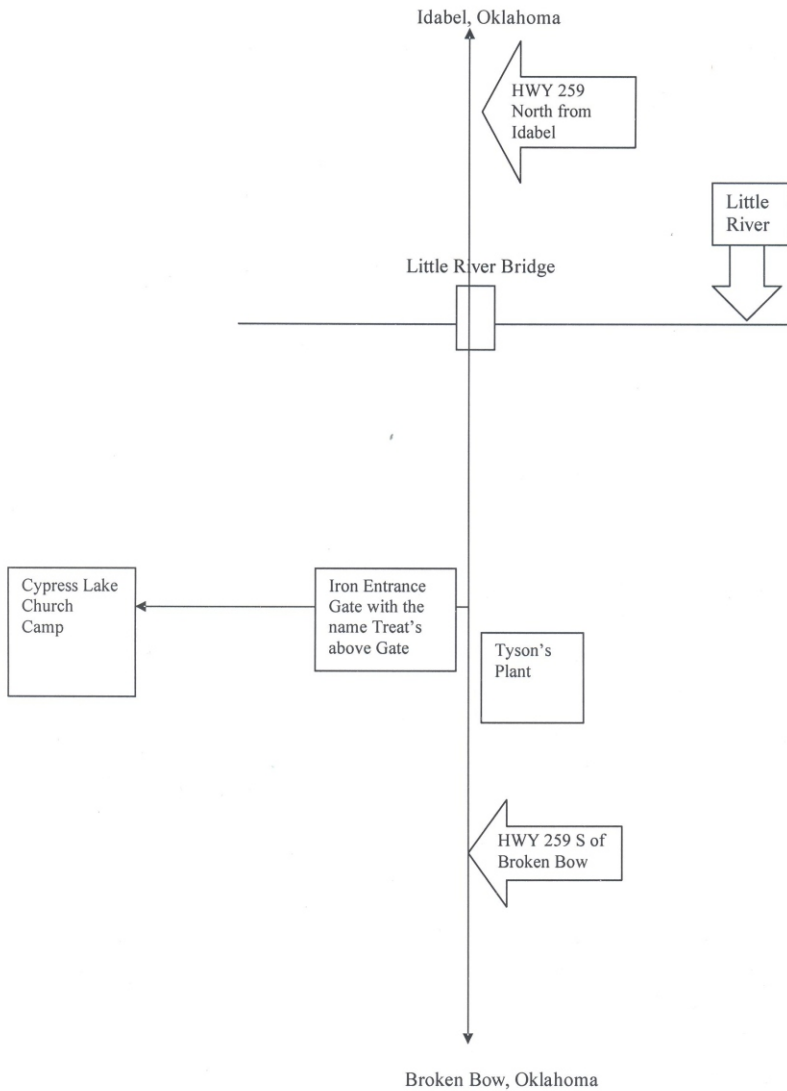

Dear brethren in Christ:

By means of this simple letter, I send you greetings, hoping you may be enjoying good health in the Lord.

I comment that during this month of April, I had much activity in some areas of Mexico:

- I visit two times a month in San Jose, Tampico, to study with the members and make new contacts. Also, each Saturday some brethren travel from Matamoros to have the Sunday meeting. Because of that, this church still does not have mature

brothers that can take the responsibilities of preaching in the local congregation.

- I traveled again to Madero City to study with the three families that have interest in the scriptures and continue to open the door that very soon some people will obey the gospel.
- A group of people in Valley City obeyed the gospel in 2004 and a church was established and remained firm for some time, but because of familiar problems the church disintegrated. During the past years I continued working with some brothers of these families for several visits, and this month began church meetings with 7 members. I have plans to visit this congregation once a month, and also other evangelists in congregations in Rio Verde City will collaborate with this church.
- Also brethren in Oaxaca City called me several times, so that I traveled to preach to them for three days. For this reason I am making plans to visit this church May 2nd-4th.
